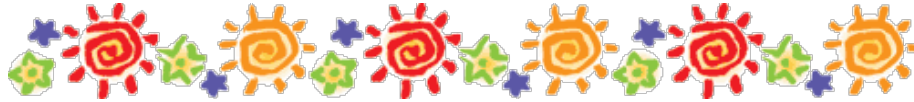

From The Rector's Desk

Dear friends in Christ,

As I write to you it is the end of May, and we are about to turn the calendar to June. In most of the country, but especially in New Jersey, it is a time when we begin to focus on summer journeys. Journeys to vacation spots, to visit family and friends, and to begin to prepare for journeys to schools far away when the college term begins. So many journeys. Some journeys are for renewal, some are for rest and still other journeys are to move us into a new and unsure future.

Every other year, one of the journeys of the summer is the J2A Pilgrimage, which will soon be upon us. When we travel with the eyes and ears of the God who sent us, we will see wonderful sights, hear wonderful sounds, meet wonderful people ... and be happy to return home.

VESTRY NOTES: The vestry will not meet during July or August, unless we have an emergency. The next regular vestry meeting will be on September 11th. At that time we will review the fall plans and the Stewardship plan adopted by the vestry.

MUSIC DEPARTMENT: My thanks to all who have participated in our music-making during this program year. The hard work and dedication of all our choristers, ringers and instrumentalists is much appreciated. You have all earned a very well-deserved break. Enjoy your summer.

While our choirs are resting, I will be planning music for next fall and beyond...that work has already begun. If you have ever thought about joining the choir or learning how to ring the handbells, now is a perfect time to consider making that commitment since everyone starts fresh in September. Check below for start-up dates, and see Lyn if you are interested.

The **Adult Choir** practices on Thursday evenings, 7:45-9pm. The choir sings a wide range of styles, from contemporary to original works, from classical to spirituals and old hymn-tunes. Members have been of high school age or above, but we are going to try to make it more of an inter-generational ensemble, so youth as young as 6th grade may come out. We already have one younger chorister signed on. Since we don't have vestments this size, we're going to need to have a fundraiser to help pay for some additional robes.

Rehearsals will resume on Thursday, September 6th. If you would like more information, or would like to try us out, please speak with Lyn.

Congratulations to Jennifer Ferguson who became our newest member to be accepted into the St. Dunstan's Guild of the diocese. This is for 10 years of service.

We are looking for new ringers in the **Handbell program**. Our beginners' group, **Praise Ringers**, has been meeting on Wednesday evenings. All of the members have been moved up into **The Bells of St. James**, so unless we have an influx of new recruits, this group will not continue in the fall. Anyone interested in ringing will need to speak with Lyn ASAP so that plans can be made. I would love to have some new ringers! Anyone can learn how to ring. Knowing how to read music is NOT required; I can teach you everything you need to know. Just ask any current ringer; several had no experience with any music before starting with the program. Youth as young as 5th grade may participate, and of course all adults are welcome. Good music readers may be able to move right into the larger group if we don't have enough for a starter choir.

The Bells of St. James will resume rehearsals on Sunday, September 9th @11:15am-12:30pm. **The Grace Notes** quartet will resume rehearsals on Thursday evenings, 7-7:45pm, beginning September 6th. Members of both groups are asked to let me know of any vacation plans so that I can work the schedule around it as much as possible. I need to get much of the planning done before mid-July.

Lyn will be attending the HMA National Seminar in Grand Rapids, Michigan in July. She will be attending concerts and classes, networking with other ringers and directors, as well as shopping for music for next year. Any ringers who may be aware of something that needs to be replaced should contact Lyn ASAP. Within a few days of returning to NJ, she and Canon Art will depart for their annual vacation. Many thanks to Alyson Setzer who will supply for Lyn during these weeks away.

We’ve set up and offer eGiving to you as a way to automate your regular weekly/monthly offering or just to use when you need it. Electronic giving offers convenience for individual congregation members and provides much-needed donation consistency for our church.

Direct Debit Giving- automatically transfer funds from your checking or savings account—very similar to writing a check but from anywhere and at any time!

Debit & Credit Card Giving- make donations automatically on a pre-determined schedule using a credit or debit card.
