From The Rector's Desk

Dear brothers and sisters in Christ,

It is the time of year for returning. We come to the beginning of the new program year. It is a time of joy and excitement. It is also a time when we see time flying past us. When we were in Maine this summer we were late enough for the end of the boys camping season. The Monday of the last week was boy's revenge- as they woke and chased their counselors having taken every pot and pan from the kitchen, at least so it seemed, and beat on them. Then on Saturday morning at 4:30 am the final "reveille" was played and they were sent off. It was a time when you saw the locals gathering and storing firewood for the upcoming winter. It was a time to see the first leaves turning and to gather the first of fall's apples. Yes, school was about to start and the new year to begin.

For us it is a time of returning as well. A time to share the summer's journeys. A time to rejoice is when and where we saw Christ on the steps of our paths. As we come back, we are like the disciples returning from being sent out by Christ. With joy and excitement they returned. As we return, think about sharing how Christ made himself known to you along your Emmaus road.



On Kick off Sunday, September 9th we again have a picnic and ice cream. Over the meal we can share our summer journeys and God moments. As we begin to think on apples this year it is good to think that we are the Apples and Christ is the Apple Tree. If that is true, we are coming to the time of harvest. Over the summer how have you ripened in Christ?

CHRISTIAN EDUCATION COMMITTEE

The committee will hold a meeting on Tuesday, September 4th at 7:00 PM. Class assignments and teaching materials for the coming year will be distributed at the meeting. We are again sending out a mailing to families with students in the program, which will include registration materials for the coming year. Christian Formation for Children and Youth (cont'd)

We will be using new teaching materials for the first time in many years, but many of the traditions will remain intact including the Communion Class dinner and shoe box altar project.

Outreach Ministries:

The *2017 - 2018 Poor Box Ministry Project* in support of Bees for Development reached the goal of \$1,000 during the summer. Bees for Development specializes in: Working to alleviate poverty; Championing biodiversity; Sharing knowledge and experience; and Facilitating fair market access.

This project was chosen because we were encouraged by the diligent work of the Stewardship Committee with their "Bee Theme." Thank you for your generous support of Bees for Development.

The *2018 - 2019 Poor Box Ministry Project* will support an Agricultural project through Episcopal Relief & Development. We will be raising money to purchase "Fruit Trees." Lemon, mango, avocado and banana trees enrich a family's food supply and farmland. Fruit trees provide a long-term sustainable source of nutrition and income. Fruit trees planted on hillsides are also used for erosion control, helping farmers maintain their land. Our goal will be \$1,000.
